#### HERBED WALLEYE SOUP

FROM THE KITCHEN OF ROCK HARBOR LODGE

#### INGREDIENTS

2 medium onions
1 tsp. garlic
2 Tbsp. butter
4 qt. chicken stock
1 ½ c. white wine
½ tsp. thyme
½ tsp. basil
½ tsp. rosemary

Salt and pepper to taste 6-10 walleye fillets

#### DIRECTIONS

Cut onions into thin wedges. Saute onion, garlic and butter until onion is translucent. Add chicken stock, white wine, thyme, basil, rosemary and salt and pepper. Heat to boiling. Simmer covered for 30 minutes. Cut walleye fillets into 1 inch pieces. Add walleye and simmer until fish is fully cooked. Makes 5 quarts.

### INSIDER SPOTLIGHT

### Captain Ed Albrecht

### When did you start fishing on Lake of the woods?

I have been fishing here my whole life. My father, Albert, worked at Arnesen's for 20 years as the Lake Foreman. Every day and every weekend that I could, I was out on the ice fishing. We live about a mile from Zippel Bay so after a long day bailing hay or shoveling grain in the summer, we would load the boat up and head out for the rest of the afternoon.

### Where are your favorite spots to fish on Lake of the Woods?

Any day that you can get on the water and it isn't rough, anywhere is a good place to wet a line. If I have to pick, I'm a big fan of fishing the big reef, Archies. It is straight north of Arnesen's Rocky Point, about 8 miles. It's a great place to jig and pull spinners, and in the hot summer months you can also down-rig anywhere near the reef.

### Do you have a favorite season to fish? Why?

Personally, I am cold weather guy so I would say winter! I get to work with the best crew on the south shore. The guides that work here are top notch, along with the dozens of other employees that make it possible. We see thousands of customers anxious to get out on the ice and chase that monster walleye. Also

another reason, there is no better feeling than standing on the ice watching the sun come up in the morning. I love seeing all the track vans race away to their fish houses loaded with people and having the feeling that it will be a good day.

### What's the biggest fish you ever caught?

I would have to say the biggest fish I've ever caught was a sturgeon. I was tip-up fishing by Lambertson's Rock. I felt a bite on the end of my line and when I set the hook, I knew it was a monster! I fought the fish for 45-60 minutes never getting a good look at it, but when I was finally able to get it to the bottom of the ice, I couldn't believe what I saw. I didn't know how big it was; all I knew is that it was going to be a tight fit through my eight inch ice hole. I got the sturgeon through the ice. I took a few pictures and released the giant. I know that

there are bigger fish out here and someday I'll find one.

### Are there any hot lures you would recommend?

In the winter, there are two hooks that never get taken off my rods. A red Lindy Flyer and a plain hook. During the summer months, I'm a big fan of gold or red, and that goes for jigging, spinners and down rigging.

### What are the keys to success to fishing lake of the woods?

The one thing that I've learned since being a guide is not to run from fish to find fish. Just be patient — fish swim! Sooner or later they will get hungry.

### What is your favorite fishing memory?

Casting off the dock for northerns with my dad when I was a kid. That's probably when I realized that I loved fishing.

#### If you could fish anywhere in the world, where would it be and why?

I would enjoy a trip to the Congo River in Africa chasing the Goliath tigerfish. I think hooking into a 6 ft. 175 lb. river monster would be the rush of a lifetime!



# MINNESOTA'S LAKE OF THE WOODS... AN ANGLER'S PARADISE!

People travel from all over the world to fish and explore Lake of the Woods. Walleyes get most of the attention, after all, this is The Walleye Capital of the World. This prolific fishery is also loaded with smallmouth bass, pike, muskies, lake sturgeon, jumbo perch and monster crappies. Whatever your taste, if you enjoy the outdoors, Lake of the Woods should be on your list.

Lake of the Woods is shared between Minnesota and Canada. The fishery is really broken up into three different areas, the Rainy River, Big Traverse Bay (the big open water basin) and the Northwest Angle.

The slow moving Rainy River feeds the big lake. 40 miles of navigable water is teeming with walleyes, pike, smallmouth bass and lake sturgeon. Resorts line the mouth of the river and look across to Canada.

The middle section is known as Big Traverse Bay. Charter boats catering to groups up to 6 anglers line the docks at local resorts in the open water months. Everything is provided, just step aboard and catch fish. Licensed charter captains take groups out targeting walleyes. With years of experience and by networking with other captains on the water, the days are typically very successful reeling in good numbers of fish.

During the winter, the soft water turns to hard water and well known resorts like Arnesen's Rocky Point provide fish houses, tracking the walleyes all winter through March. Some fish out of a day house while others stay overnight on the ice in a comfy sleeper house. Whatever your choice, the holes are drilled and the temperature inside is balmy.

From heated resort to heated fish house with the holes drilled on top of walleyes and saugers, it's not a bad way to spend a winter day. Guides will even clean your fish!


The third section of Lake of the Woods is the Northwest Angle. This area is the northernmost point of the contiguous U.S. and is where the 14,552 islands of the lake begin. Basically, you are fishing amongst islands, eagles, bears, deer and some of the most beautiful scenery in North America. Some resorts are rustic with log cabins in the woods all the way up to full service resorts with high speed internet and all of the amenities of home. Regardless of your preference, the fishing is almost as good as the adventure.

There is a nice variety of full service resorts all around the lake. No roughing

it here, enjoy the modern conveniences, delicious meals and fun taverns in this northern MN destination.

Visitors enjoy good fishing all year long. Come for the world class fishing but appreciate the wildlife, natural beauty, variety of resorts, and the "MN nice" culture.

Located in the north woods of Minnesota where there may be as many deer as people, finding a variety of good food is not hard to come by. A fresh fish fry or two should be on the list. There is nothing like fresh walleye, fried potatoes, beans and fresh bread. Some resorts cook up your days catch and provide all of the fixings. Try locally grown wild rice. Maybe some freshly prepared prime rib, a homemade pizza or a half pound burger basket. Top it off with some delicious dessert, you are on vacation.

A word of advice when you come up, bring your appetite for fresh walleye, a good camera and a hankering for adventure!
