FROM THE HISTORIC FILES

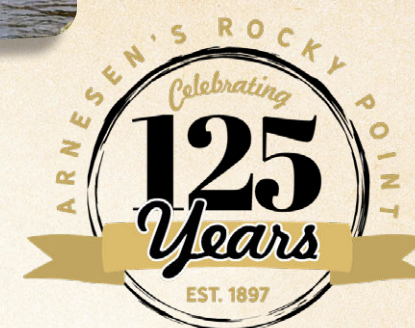

Large Group Recipe

INGREDIENTS

- 2 - 10 lb. cans cooked wild rice
- 1 lb. cooked large shrimp
- 1 lb. cooked smoked sausage
- 1 small can water chestnuts
- 1 small can mini corn
- 3 cans cream of mushroom soup*
- 2 cans cream of celery soup
- Salt and pepper to taste

DIRECTIONS

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Boil shrimp for 3 minutes and peel. Boil or fry the smoked sausage until done. Cut into chunks. Add all ingredients to a mixing bowl and stir thoroughly. Place mixture into prepared baking dish and bake for 1 hour.

**If needed, add more cream of mushroom soup to make the dish creamier.*

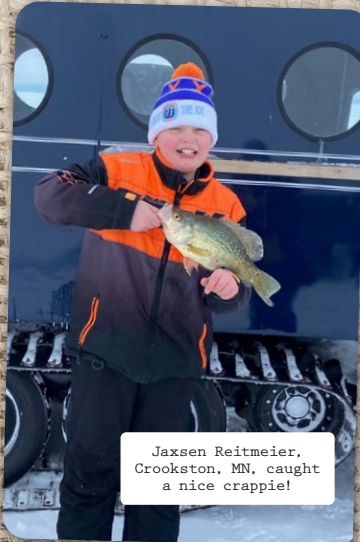

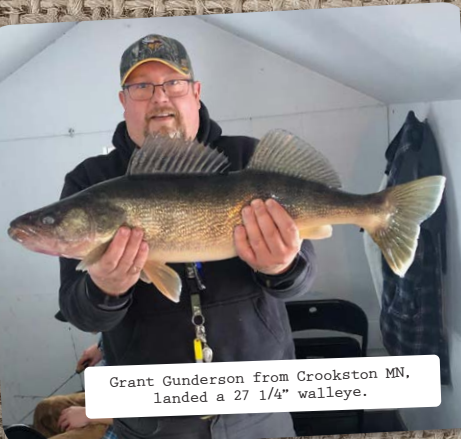

I was 6 years old, so I've had 50 years experience on Lake of the Woods.

I live on Birch Beach, so anywhere from Zippie Bay to Twin Islands.

Do you have a favorite season to fish? Why?

I love walleye fishing in early June. There's a fantastic bite & great weather.

What's the biggest fish you've caught?

I've caught numerous 29's, but haven't cracked the 30 inch mark for walleyes yet. My biggest northern was 43 inches.

Are there any hot lures/tackle that you can recommend?

My go-to in the winter is a Buck-Shot spoon by Northland. My go-to in the summer is a JB "Vibra Flash" Hot Flash spinner.

What's your best piece of advice to the novice fisherman?

Be patient and put your time in on the water, especially on Lake of the Woods. I see amazing fish almost every time that I'm out there.

The Legend of Gull Rock

The Coast Guard light blinks steadily throughout the night, not only to warn of danger, but also to act as a guide for lake travelers as they find their way back to the shoreline.

The light sits high on the legendary Gull Rock that is painted white by its seagull inhabitants who make it their home during the more temperate times of the year. Not an ounce of foliage grows on the huge rock. Many people believe it is because of the large population of birds that dwell there, but the great legend of Gull Rock tells a different story.

It is said that Gull Rock was once green and heavy with foliage and its beauty was unmatched. It was a time believed to be when the tribes of the area were waging war and battle against one another. One blistering day, the temperatures soared to well over 110 degrees and the tribes called a temporary truce so they could cool off at the water's edge.

While the tribesmen, women and children gathered, a cloud of great proportion arose from Gull Rock. There was a Great Spirit within the cloud. It spoke to the

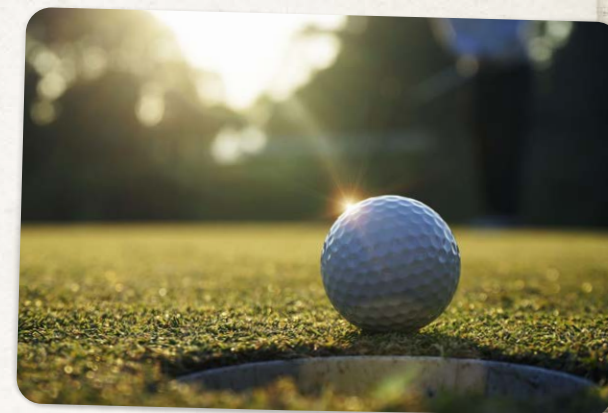
people and told them of impending encounters with a white race of people who would try to take their lands. The spirit told them to unite and stop fighting among themselves and prepare for that time. When the Great Spirit concluded its proclamation, it ascended off the rock and vanished in the sky, taking with it every tree, every blade of grass, every piece of foliage, leaving Gull Rock as we know it now.

While some see this massive outcropping of ledge rock a marker or guide, others see it as a reminder of a culture that holds fast to its history and legends. One thing is certain, Gull Rock is an extraordinary work of Mother Nature.

Investing in the Future

You may have noticed a lot of digging and heavy equipment around the resort in the past year. In the fall of 2021, we began a project in conjunction with North Star Electric, Wiktel Telephone Company and Co-Op Services of Baudette. The goal is to update our infrastructure and bring Rocky Point to a new era. The project will result in having all of the primary power underground, a centralized underground pipeline system for propane (no more big white tanks around the resort) and fiber optic cable for the internet. Yes, you heard correctly - this means internet in our cabins! The work will continue into 2023 and will hopefully be finished by the end of the year. 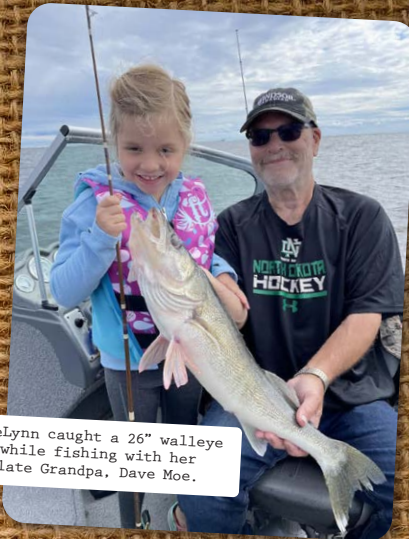

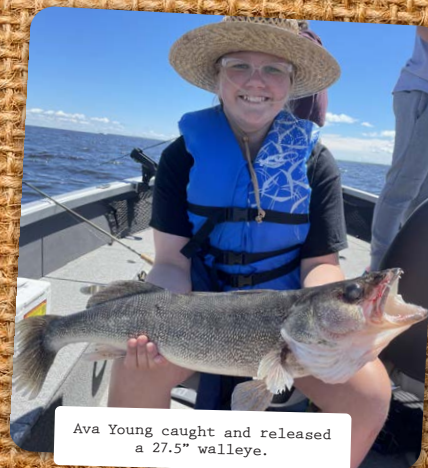

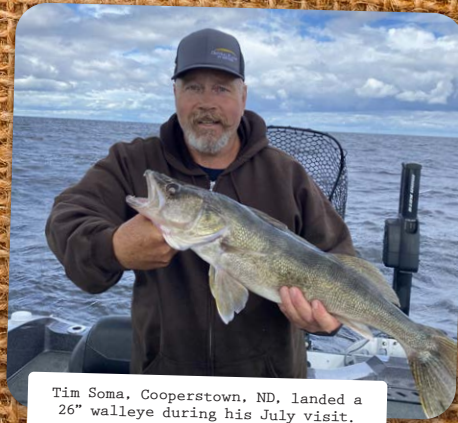
